

Training Newsflash : Sept 2020

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Introduction

We are mindful that going forward into next year you will face many uncertainties; the possibility of further lockdowns and school closures and the wider impact of Covid-19 on the school community.

For this reason, we have frozen the costs for most of our services and courses and will carry forward unused days into next year. We also recognise the need to be even more flexible in listening to you and delivering what you may need at short notice.

The safety of our staff and the school communities we work with is of the utmost importance to us and we have a range of working options available to you. These include remote working, online training and audits, and where appropriate, visiting you in school when guidance allows.

We appreciate that now more than ever, you may wish for your professional development to be held locally. Wherever possible, with the exception of the key leadership programmes, we will aim to arrange this for you.

Rest assured that national guidance will be followed closely and risk assessments put in place for centrally held courses, which we hope to commence towards the autumn half term.

Change to course/programme dates

Due to Covid-19, our consultants have adjusted their training offer to best support virtual learning until at least October half term. It is likely to be for the whole term and we will inform you of any further changes as soon as possible.

Because of this, the dates of courses and programmes on our website and downloadable booklet may differ from the printed booklet sent out to schools in July.
